| Maternity | 1 | Cherbourg – antenatal and postnatal care provided by midwives; birthing in Kingaroy; visiting obstetrician from Kingaroy supports with clinic; high risk pregnancies managed in partnership with larger facilities including Kingaroy. |
| Medical | 2 | General Practitioners and Senior Medical Officers provide medical services in both in and out patients. Daily discussion and review of cases undertaken by senior medical officers. |
| Medical–Children’s | 2 | Senior Medical Officers provide services, Cilento Catch Team provides support and involved with patient care. |
| Medication | 2 | Pharmacist on site during work hours; provides services between two facilities; safe medication dispensing by nursing after-hours; and pharmacist provides medication reviews – onsite (i.e. outpatients / wards) |
| Medical Imaging | 1 | Self-audits of x-rays; and supported by tele-radiology based in Toowoomba; plus bedside ultrasound and sonographer when available. |

| Renal | 2 | Self-dialysis chairs Cherbourg. Access to Renal Unit Kingaroy and Specialist based in T'ba. |
| Surgical–Children's | | Step down for pain relief. In case of visiting surgeons (e.g. ENT – Deadly Ears), care provided on the wards post operative for simple procedures. |
